killed in Tirah IBOs: ISPR

At least 25 terrorists, including a ring leader,
were gunned down by security forces in
multiple ongoing intelligence-based
operations (IBOs) in Tirah valley of Khyber
district since August 20, the military's media
wing said on Tuesday.
According to Inter-Services Public Relations
(ISPR), the security forces are conducting
"extensive IBOs" in Tirah valley against the
Tehreck-e-Tabbar Pakistan (TPP) labelled as
Fitna-Al-Khwarij and militant outfits
"Laskare-Islam and Jamat-ul-Ahra".
These operations, it said, were based on
robust intelligence and resulted into major

setbacks to Fitna-Al-Khwarij and its affiliates.
During the intelligence-based operations being conducted since August 20, the security forces so far killed 25 terrorists, including a ring leader named Abuzar aka Saddam.
"However, four soldiers, having fought gallantly, paid the ultimate sacrifice and embraced martyrdom", the ISPR added.
"The heavy losses inflicted upon Fitna-Al-Khwarij in these operations is testament to the valor and commitment of security forces to eliminate the menace of terrorism from the country," it concluded.

On Aug 25, terrorists attacked a check post in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Central Kurram, resulting in martyrdom of one policeman.

## 500mm Rain Forecast: Sindh Braces

The Sindh government has been alerted to the potential of up to 500mm of rainfall in lower Sindh cities during the forecasted period from August 27 to August 30. In response, Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah convened a high-level meeting where civic bodies, the irrigation department, and other key stakeholders were instructed to prepare for the possibility of severe urban flooding and related challenges. Karachi city faced severe flooding, with several key roads and areas inundated. The rainfall led to considerable disruption, widespread power outages, and loss of life. Several areas were submerged, causing severe traffic jams and stranding residents. The city faced severe flooding, with several key roads and areas inundated. Widespread power outages, and loss of life. all departments to be vigilant, particularly in cities like Thatta, Sujawal, Badin, and Tando Muhammad Khan. Preventive measures include cleaning storm drains, patrolling river embankments, and ensuring that emergency supplies and equipment are ready for deployment. The authorities have also established a rain-emergency cell to coordinate efforts and assist the public during this period. The Local Government Department has taken steps to clean major storm water drains in Karachi and maintain drainage systems in other large cities. The PDMA has stocked essential supplies like tents, tarpaulin sheets, mosquito nets, and hygiene kits, ready for dispatch if needed. Machinery has been arranged to pump out water from low-lying areas. the heavy rains and advised the Fisheries Department to warn fishermen to take precautions. The irrigation department has been directed to patrol river embankments and monitor the situation closely to prevent any breaches or flooding. A rainemergency cell has been established at the CM Secretariat for citizens to lodge

complaints or seek help, the

potential impact of the heavy rainfall and ensure public safety Accelerate the cleaning and maintenance of storm drains and sewer systems in Karachi and other vulnerable cities to ensure efficient water drainage. Invest in upgrading and expanding the drainage infrastructure to handle future extreme weather events. Deploy water pumping equipment to low-lying areas in advance to manage water accumulation and prevent urban flooding. Increase patrols and monitoring of river embankments and key water channels to promptly address any breaches or overflows. Conduct extensive awareness campaigns through media, alerting the public about the dangers of entering the sea and other high-risk areas during the rainfall period. Establish rapid response teams in each district to assist in evacuation, rescue operations, and providing relief to affected populations. Set up emergency coordination centres across the province to facilitate real-time communication between government agencies, the military, and local authorities. Maintain and publicize the rain-emergency cell hotline, ensuring citizens can quickly report issues and receive assistance. Ensure the Provincial Disaster Management Authority (PDMA) has sufficient supplies, including tents, hygiene kits and food items, and streamline distribution channels to affected areas. Deploy health workers to provide medical care and distribute mosquito nets and water purification tablets to prevent the spread of waterborne diseases. By implementing these solutions, the Sindh government can effectively manage the anticipated heavy rainfall, minimize the impact on communities, and ensure a swift response to any emergencies that may arise. Karachi has experienced several instances of heavy rainfall that have led to significant challenges, including urban flooding and infrastructure damage. Karachi received record-breaking rainfall in August 2020, with some areas recording over 230mm in a single day. This resulted in widespread urban flooding, power outages, and significant disruption to daily life. The rain in August 2020

was considered one of the

heaviest in the city's history, leading to extensive damage to property and infrastructure. In July 2009, Karachi experienced around 245mm of rain in just a few hours. On July 24, 2003, Karachi received approximately 133mm of rain within a few hours. This heavy downpour led to significant flooding across the city, with many roads and lowlving areas becoming impassable. Karachi received around 207mm of rain in August 1979. The city experienced severe urban flooding, causing widespread damage to infrastructure and property. The 1979 rain is remembered as one of the most significant rain events in Karachi's history. These instances highlight the vulnerability of Karachi to heavy rains, particularly given its challenges with drainage and urban infrastructure. Each event has prompted calls for improved infrastructure and disaster preparedness to better manage future rainfall events. Lahore, like Karachi, has experienced several significant instances of heavy rainfall that have led to urban flooding and other challenges, heavy rainfall events in Lahore's history. In July 2018, Lahore recorded 288mm of rainfall within just 10 hours, making it one of the heaviest rainfalls in the city's history. This extreme downpour led to widespread flooding in many areas of Lahore, including the iconic Mall Road and several residential neighbourhoods. In September 2014, Lahore experienced around 200mm of rainfall over a 24-hour period. The heavy rain caused extensive urban flooding, with many streets and low-lying areas submerged. In August 2011, Lahore received 170mm of rain in a single day. This rainfall caused severe flooding across the city, particularly in lowlying areas. On July 13, 1980, Lahore recorded approximately 207mm of rainfall in a single day. Lahore witnessed around 221mm of rain on August 6, 1976. The downpour led to severe urban flooding, with several key roads and areas submerged under water. These instances highlight the challenges Lahore faces with heavy rainfall. Each event has underscored the need for better infrastructure planning and flood management strategies in

## Pakistan aims to raise \$4bn from Middle Eastern banks, SBP governor

Jameel Ahmad says recent interest rate cuts have slowed down inflation and brought current account under control

Looking to plug its external financing gaps, Pakistan plans to raise up to \$4 billion from Middle Eastern commercial banks by the next fiscal year, the Governor of the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP), Jameel Ahmad, told Reuters on Tuesday

Tuesday.
The governor's optimism stems from the government's efforts to roll over \$12 billion in loans from China, Saudi Arabia, and the United Arab Emirates (UAE),

according to sources. In a wide-ranging interview with the wire, the SBP governor said Pakistan was also in the "advanced stages" of securing \$2 billion in additional external financing required for IMF approval of a \$7 billion bailout programme. Additionally, as per sources, the

government has requested an extra \$1.2 billion loan from Sand \$1.2 billion loan from Saudi Arabia to bridge a \$2 billion

financing gap. Pakistan and the IMF reached an Pakistan and the IMF reached an agreement on the loan programme in July, subject to approval from the IMF's executive board and it obtaining 'timely confirmation of necessary financing assurances from Pakistan's development and bilateral partners".

However, the country is missing from the IMF agenda until

September 4, 2024, according to the lender's schedule of its Executive Board meetings released on August 26. Asked about monetary policy. Ahmad said recent interest rate cuts in Pakistan have had the desired effect, with inflation continuing to slow and the current account remaining under control, despite the cuts. Pakistan's annual consumer price index inflation was 11.1% in July, having fallen from highs of over

index inflation was 11.1% in July, having fallen from highs of over 30% in 2023.

"The Monetary Policy Committee will review all the se developments," Ahmad said, adding that future rate decisions could not be pre-determined. The central bank cut rates for two straight meetings from a historic high of 22% to 19.5%, and will meet again to review monetary policy on September 12.

He added that the central bank's mandate was to ensure price and financial stability before shifting



## Gaza ceasefire hopes dim, families flee after new evacuation orders

The Deir Al-Balah municipality says Israeli evacuation orders have so far displaced 250,000 people

Israel issued new evacuation orders for Deir Al-Balah in the central Gaza Strip late on Sunday, forcing more families to flee, saying its forces intended to act against militant group Hammas and others operating in the area. In recent days, Israel has issued several evacuation orders across Gaza, the most since the beginning of the 10-month war, rompting an outcry from Palestinians, the United Nations and relief officials over the reduction of humanitarian zones and the absence of safe areas. The Deir Al-Balah municipality says Israeli evacuation orders have so far displaced 250,000 people.

In a statement posted on X, the Israeli military urged residents in certain zones to move immediately to the west, as the acre they are in is "considered a dangerous combat cone". Israeli military strikes killed at least seven Palestinians on Monday, medies said Two were killed in Deir Al-Balah, where around a million people were sheltering, two at a school in the Al-Nusseirat camp and three in

the border with Egypt. Seven others were killed in two

the border with Egypt.

Seven others were killed in two separate Israeli strikes, five in a car in Khan Younis and two people at a school in Gaza City, medies said.

The new orders forced many families and patients to leave Al-Aqas Hospital, the main medical facility in Deir Al-Balah, where hundreds of thousands of residents and displaced people had taken shelter, for fear of bombardments.

Judge in Texas orders pause on Biden program that offers legal status to spouses of US citizens

A federal judge in Texas on Monday paused a Biden administration policy that would give spouses of US.
citizens legal status without having to first leave the country, dealing at least a temporary setback to one of the biggest presidential actions to ease a path to citizenship in years. The administrative stay issued by U.S. District Judge J. Campbell Barker comes just days after 16 states, led by Republican attorneys general, challenged the program that could benefit an estimated 500,000 immigrants in the country, plus about 50,000 of their children. The states accused the administration of bypassing Congress for "blatant political purposes."
One of the states leading the challenge is Texas, which in the lawsuit claimed the state has had to pay tens of millions of dollars annually from health care to law enforcement because of immigrants living in the state without legal status.
President Joe Biden announced the program in June. The court order, which lasts for two weeks but could be extended, comes one week after the Department of Homeland Security began accepting applications.

Russia's deadly overnight barrage of missiles and drones hits over half of Ukraine



KYIV, Ukraine
Russia battered much of Ukraine on firing
scores of missiles and drones that killed
four people, injured more than a dozen and
damaged energy facilities in attacks that
President Volodymyr Zelenskyy described

damaged energy facilities in attacks that President Wolodymyr Zelenskyy described as "vile". The barrage of over 100 missiles and a similar number of drones began around midnight and continued through daybreak in what appeared to be Russia's biggest onslaught in weeks. Ukraine's air force said swarms of Russian drones fired at eastern, northern, southern, and central regions were followed by volleys of cruise and ballistic missiles. "Like most previous Russian strikes, this one was just as vile, targeting critical civilian infrastructure," Zelenskyy said, adding that most of the country was targeted — from the Kharkiv region and Kyiv to Odesa and the west. Explosions were heard in the eapital of Kyiv. Power and water supplies in the city were disrupted by the attack, Mayor Vitali Klitschko said. Ukrainies's Prime Minister Denys Shmyhal said Russia fired drones, cruise missiles and hypersonic ballistie Kinzhal missiles at 15 Ukrainian regions — more than half the country. "The energy infrastructure has once again."

hypersonic bullistic Kinzhal missiles at 15 Ukrainian regions — more than half the country.

"The energy infrastructure has once again become the target of Russian terrorists." Shmyhal said, adding that the state-owned power grid operator, Ukrenergo, has been forced to implement emergency power cuts to stabilize the system.

He urged Ukraine's allies to provide it with long-range weapons and permission to use them on targets inside Russia. "In order to stop the barbaric shelling of Ukrainian cities, it is necessary to destroy the place from which the Russian missiles are launched," Shmyhal said. "We count on the support of our allies and will definitely make Russia pay."

U.S. President Joe Biedn called the Russian attack on energy infrastructure "outrageous" and said he had "rec" outrageous and said he had "rec" as the country of the state of long-range precision air- and sea-based weapons and strike drones against critical energy infrastructure facilities that support the operation of Ukraine's military-industrial complex. All designated targets were hit."
