[in the court of law] or not, it should hand over the militants to Pakistan." At least six people including five Chinese nationals were killed after a sticide bomber rammed into the bus transporting the staff working on the Dasu hydropower project in Bisham, Shangla district, in March this year.

district, in March this year Condoling the deaths of Chinese engineers in the attack, Prime Minister Sheibaz Sharif had said that the "cowardly attack" was aimed at creating a wedge between iron brother Pakistan and China.

In view of the investigation report, the interior minister said that the TTP operated the Besham terror attack on Chinese citizens from inside Afghanistan. "[Pakistan has formally] requested the interim government in Afghanistan to arrest the leadership of [banned] TTP," he added.

Potential Unrest in Gilgit-Baltistan **Over the Transfer of Tourism Sites:**



Although the federal government "somehow managed" to quell the public uproar and violent protests in Azad Jammu Kashmir by accepting the demands, there is a growing concern that a similar resentment could arise in Gilgit-Baltistan. This unrest is anticipated in response to the transfer of around 44 tourism sites to Green Tourism Limited, a new company lourism Limited, a new company believed to be a military entity established under the guidance of the Special Investment Facilitation Council (SIFC). Soon after surfacing the list of tourism sites, including guest houses and motels, being leased out to the company following an agreement signed with the GB government, social media flooded with strong criticism and opposition to the initiative, which according to the locals would deprive them of the tourism industry, which has become a lifeline for the past few ears. Meanwhile, leaders of Majlis-e-WahdatulMuslimeen, a religio-political party, and some other political and civil society representatives, including the

Awami Action Committee Gilgit-Baltistan and the Das Khareem Supreme Council of Astore, have supiene Content of Assort, have announced strong opposition to the initiative. Though the government, through its spokespersons, has tried to convince the people that the move will facilitate local and foreign investment in the tourism industry, it seems that they are not being able to convince the public which fears the permanent handing over of the important sites to a private firm or army. The initially private firm of army. The initially leased-out 44 tourism sites in Gilgit-Baltistan include 7 Pakistan Tourism Development Corporation (PTDC) motels, 20 PWD guest houses, and 17 Forest Department sites, which have now been leased out to the company for 30 years. Communications & Works Department properties include guest houses in Phandar, Gupis, Naltar, Karimabad, Hopper, Sumayar, Chillas, Babusar, Rama, Eidgah, Minimerg, Kachura, Shigar, Baltoro Skardu, Hamidgarh, Khaplu, Singul, Passu, Hamidgari, Khapiu, Singui, Passu, Thalichi, and Chilum. Forest Department properties include the Wildlife Hut Naltar, Forest Hut Naltar, DehecKhunjerab, Babusar, Rama, Chilm, Old Forest Building, Kargah, Jutal, Phandar, Gahkuch, Borith Lake, Buner Das, Hoto, Olding, and Sailing. According to the reports, some of the most significant places that are also sed to Green Tourism Limited

Green Company has acquired the Baltoro Guest House in Skardu,

previously utilized by officials from other districts visiting the Skardu headquarters for official

2. The PWD Guest House in Chilas has also been taken over by Green Company, formerly used by officials from other districts visiting the Chilas headquarters for official purposes.

The green company will also take over Forest Guest House in Chillim. The Guest House serves as the entry point to Deosai National Park from the Astore side and previously functioned as both the office and residence for the park staff. 4. The

The Forest Rest House DheeKhunjerab serves as the entry point to Khunjerab National Park from the Pakistan side and previously functioned as both the office and residence for the park

5.55 kanals of Forest Park in Skardu, the sole recreational park for the public in Skardu, have been leased to Green Tourism Limited.

6. 450Kanals Hoto Plantation, the biggest plantation in Skardu, is also leased to Green Company Limited. 7.92 acres of land in Phander, Ghizer, a significant tourist attraction in Gilgit Baltistan renowned for its beauty and lakes. are also being leased to Green Tourism Limited.

There are dozens of such guest houses and tourist sites that are given on lease to the Green Tourism Company.

As per documents, a search on the Securities and Exchange Commission's official website shows that Green Tourism was registered at the Company Registration Office in Islamabad on January 26, 2024.

The official of Green Tourism Limited claimed that despite having immense potential, Pakistan lacks a robust tourism ecosystem, which could generate up to \$30 billion by 2030.

The project will prioritize local human resources, aiming to create 300 direct and approximately 3,0004,000 indirect jobs in GB. To harness and promote GB's vast tourism potential, comprehensive global marketing strategies will be implemented. All projects will adhere to environmental sustainability principles, ensuring no trees are cut during development.

Furthermore, local cuisines artifacts, and cultural heritage will be actively promoted to enrich the tourism experience and support

local communities.
The Special Assistant to Information to the CM of the GB government, Eiman Shah, and the spokesman for the GB government, FaizUllahFaraq, claimed that the guest house of the PWD and Forest Department and

the PTDC Motel have been lossmaking entities as they are used by government officials and guests on subsidized rates without payment most of the time

Their maintenance and renovation have also been a burden on the government and institutions. By leasing out these tourist entities the government would facilitate only renovation, development, and better maintenance of such facilities but also earn a good share in the heads of rent and profits.Once these entities are functional and run successfully by the private investors, the army would step back and let them run the business," the sources claimed while replying to a query regarding apprehension of the army's role in the tourism business. According to him, private investors, who are already in the tourism business in the rest of the country, would turn the guest houses and motels into 4star hotels, whose facilities are still lacking in GB.

The officials also clarified that 35% of the income generated from this investment will go to the Gilgit-Baltistan government, in addition to a 20% annual rent from the properties. They also mentioned the creation of a tourism management fund, where 20% of the company's total profit will be allocated. This fund will be managed by a Joint Management Board, comprising three representatives each from the government and the institution, to romote tourism in the region.

Faraq explained that these arrangements were made under the Special Investment Facilitation Council (SIFC), involving federal and provincial government officials and the investment board, aimed at bringing prosperity to the area. He assured that the military's role would be limited to providing the necessary support to build confidence. He emphasized that the ownership of all guest houses will remain with the Gilgit-

Baltistan government. However, a representative of civil society claimed that the initiative was needed at a time when the tourism industry was already flourishing in the area, with mostly private investment and the private sector's involvement

He said instead of leasing out the entities to a third company from the center, the GB government should have offered the facilities to the local industry to run and contribute revenue to the government.

As per the copy of the agreement, the Secretary of Tourism Gilgit Baltistan Rana Muhammad Saleem Afzal had signed the agreement on behalf of the GB government, while Arsalan Ahmed Malik had signed on behalf of the Green Tourism Company as a second party on April 23, 2024. At a press conference on

Surprisingly, another very old Sanskrit-based language of Pakistan (then Eastern Wing), received recognition from the UN in the context of a four-year-long movement since 1948 to achieve officialdom of the Bengali language. The 21st Feb. (1952) declared by the world body as International Mother Language Day is a worldwide annual observance to promote awareness of linguistic and cultural diversity and to promote multilingualism.

The Germanic roots of English are evident in the many words that are virtually the same in both modern tongues.

Saudi Arabia, the biggest US arms customer, has chafed under those restrictions, which froze the kind of weapons sales that previous U.S. administrations had provided for decades.


