Punjab CM Maryam approves construction of new corridors

All three projects worth Rs210 billion would be completed by December 2025


Punjab Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz on Tuesday approved construction of new corridors in Punjab. CM Maryam gave formal assent to make new corridors in the province in a special meeting presided over by her. It was decided in the meeting that two-way roads would be built from Sahiwal to Chichawatin, from Rajana to Layyah and from Shorkot to Charagh Wali jihang whereas one-way road from Depalpur to Vehari would be converted into a two-way road.

All three projects worth Rs210 billion would be completed by December 2025 with the collaboration between the Punjab Government and the Asian Development Bank (ADB).
Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz ordered

the start of construction on the new corridor in three months, all three corridors will be completed with the cooperation of the Asian Development Bank and the Punjab government. Maryam Nawaz said that the roads corridors connecting the big cities. The road corridor project will not only reduce travel difficulties but also contribute to economic development.

A special meeting was held under the chairmanship of Punjab Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz in which approval was given to build new corridors in different cities. It was decided in the meeting that a two-way road will be built from Sahiwal to Chicha Watani. Rajnan to Leh, Dipalput to Wahari. The single road will be converted into a two-lane road, while a new two-lane road will be built up to Shorkot Jhang Chiragwali.

According to sources, authorities allege that the digital media cell at PTI's office had become a hub for international disinformation, where anti-Pakistan propaganda was being carried out in collaboration with enemy agencies.

Stoff mits Conceptual ISLAMABAD: Jamata-c-Islami (JI) leader Hafiz Nacemur Rehman criticized previous governments, including those led by former military ruler General (retd) Pervaiz Musharraf, PPP, PML-N, and PTI, for making agreements with Independent Power Producers (IPPs) that are detrimental to the public. Addressing a press conference at the JI stin at Rawalonids?

Addressing a press conference at the JI sit-in at Rawalpindi's Liaquat Bagh, which entered its fifth day, Hafiz Naeem highlighted that the protest has sparked hope among the 250 million citizens of Pakistan.

The current electricity bills, he argued, are unaffordable, impacting children's education and household expenses. Hafiz Nacem demanded that he IPP agreements be made public, accusing the government of incompetence and corruption for failing to renegotiate these deals. Welcoming and thanking PTPs supremo Imran Khan for supporting the protest, Hafiz Nacem noted that the PPp intitated the IPP agreements while the PTI government negotiated with 35 companies. PBR employees, he claimed, are involved in corruption amounting to one trillion

rupes annually. He urged Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif to announce that no minister or government official would use vehicles larger than 1300cc, asserting that such a move could save 1350 billion rupees. Criticizing the government for not implementing this policy, Hafüz Naeem accused the rulers of living in luxury at the expense of the public.

Devastating rains in Kohat claim lives of 11 family members

Rescue efforts continue as the community mourns the devastating incident

Soon i imes Correspondent Islamabad Eleven members of a family, including women and children, drowned in Kohat after torrential rains flooded their basement, The incident occurred in the Old Bazid Khel area of Dara Adam Khel, as heavy rainfall continued across Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa. Rescue 1122 officials reported that the family was trapped in the basement of Amjad's house when rainwater inundated the area.

Emergency teams responded swiftly, recovering 11 bodies and initially searching for a missing girl, who was later found.

who was later found. Governor Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa, Faisal Karim, expressed deep sorrow overthe tragic loss of lives. Continuous heavy rains in Peshawar, Swabi, and surrounding



areas have caused severe flooding, with roads and low-lying areas submerged. In Swabi, torrential rain damaged crops, including tobacco and maize, and disrupted electricity supply as numerous feeders

Additionally, the roof of a livestock shed in Kotha village collapsed,

trapping two bulls, which were later rescued by emergency teams.
A day earlier, the Provincial Disaster Management Authority (PDMA) reported that all rivers and streams in Punjab are experiencing normal water flow amidst the ongoing monsoon raise.

According to the PDMA spokesperson, the water flow in dams and burnages is also stable. The current board is a stable of the current Dam is at 58%, while Tarbela Dam is at 69%, Indian dams on the Sutlej, Beas, and Ravi virers have variet relevels up to 30%. The monsoon rain pattern is expected to continue until July 31. The PDMA has forecasted more monsoon rains in most districts of Punjab over the next 24 hours.

\$101 million US Aid to Counter Chinese Influence



The US administration has provided financial support to Pakistan to combat terrorism, particularly during major counterterrorism operations. The Enhanced Partnership with Pakistan Act and various budget allocations have underlined the strategic importance of Pakistan in regional stability and counterterrorism efforts. In this regard The recent request for \$101 million in the 2024 budget aims to continue supporting Pakistan's counterterrorism operations, strengthen its democracy, and stabilize its economy. The budget request also reflects concerns about Pakistan's heavy reliance on Chinese investments. The US aims to reduce Islamabad's dependence on Beijing, emphasizing that US investments represent the future compared to China's past investments. Beijing has previously extended financial assistance to Pakistan, including rolling over \$2.4 billion in loans to help avert a financial crisis While the War on Terror (2001 2008) Post-9/11 Period. ISLAMABAD: Web Desk Pakistan's finance ministry on Tuesday released its monthly outlook for July stating that the Consumer Price Index (CPI) inflation reached cusp of the single-digit range. "The CPI inflation was recorded at 12.6 per cent on year on year (YoY) basis in June 2024, compared to 11.8pc in the previous month and 29.4pc in June 2023. The average annual inflation fell to 23.4pc in FY2024 from 29.2pc last year," the report stated.

The monthly outlook noted that Pakistan's economy was moving towards stability in fiscal year 2023-24, with decreasing inflation, a surplus in the primary fiscal account, a negligible current account deficit and a stable exchange rate. "In the real sector, agriculture outperformed, whereas large-scale

ne 2024. CPI inflation "In June 2024, CPI inflation reached the cusp of the single-digit range while the external account position improved due to contained imports resulting from prudent fiscal and monetary management, while exports and remittances increased significantly," the report said.

To further strengthen stability, the government has recently reached a stall-level agreement with 1MF on a 37-month Extended Fund Facility Arrangement (EFF) for \$7 billion, itsays. According to the report, in FY2024, tractor production reached 45,529, marking a 43.5 percent increase from FY2025. In FY2024, the current account deficit shrank to \$0.7 billion compared to \$3.3 billion last year. Goods exports increased by 11.5 percent, reaching \$31.1 billion, while imports remained at \$53.2 billion FY2023 (0.9% growth). This has led to a goods trade deficit of \$22.1 billion, down from \$24.8 billion last year.

Pakistan's total liquid foreign exchange reserves were recorded at \$14.7 billion on July 12, 2024, with the State Bank of

Pakistan's reserves at \$9.4 billion. During FY2024, the money supply (M2) increased by 15.5 percent, compared to 14.2 percent in the previous year. This increase was driven by the growth in the banking sector's net foreign assets by Rs 540.6 billion, contrasting with a decrease last year. In May 2024, Pakistan Poverty Alleviation Fund, through its 24 partner organizations, disbursed \$2.913 interest-free loams amounting to Rs 1.38 billion. From February 2023 to March 2024, the government disbursed From February 2025 to march 2024, the government disbursed Rs 83.683 billion to beneficiaries for business under the Prime Minister Youth Business & Agriculture Loan Schome
